The Cook Area Ambulance provides an essential service to Cook and the surrounding area.

The ambulance provides emergency services for the city, surrounding townships and mutual aid to surrounding communities. In addition, support is provided to the hospital for transfers to other facilities, to the fire department during fires, and stand-by support for community activities and school athletic events.

As a paid volunteer on the Cook Ambulance, you are trained to a national level and continuously practice your skills. Our service provides monthly skills training as well as specialty training provided by other organizations such as the Miller Dwan Burn Center, the Cook Hospital Staff and the Lake Vermilion Fire Brigade.

You are never asked to do anything unless you have the necessary training and are comfortable in your skills. You and your other team members are all trained to the same level.... it's never just you! You are afforded the opportunity to work with state of the art equipment and work side by side with a special class of individuals whose passion is to help others.
